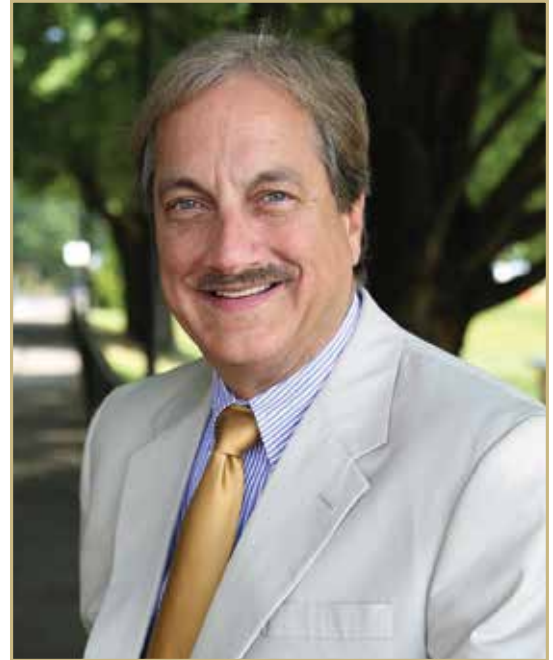

Tom Durkin Named New Principal

After a nationwide search, Mr. Tom Durkin has been selected as the new Principal/Chief Academic Officer, beginning June 12, 2017.

As a Catholic educator for over 30 years, Mr. Durkin spent the majority of his career at Loyola Blakefield in Towson, Maryland, teaching English, eventually becoming the English Department Chair, and then working as a Learning Specialist in Murray Learning Services for students with learning differences. He has coached championship-winning teams in both tennis and forensics.

In his current role, Mr. Durkin is the Assistant Principal for Academics at St. Vincent Pallotti High School in Laurel, Maryland, where he oversees teacher evaluations, scheduling, and professional development. Under his guidance, Pallotti has developed two new academic departments and curricula for four new AP courses.

Mr. Durkin completed his undergraduate degree from St. Joseph's University and has earned a Master's degree in Modern Studies from Loyola University Maryland.



"It was clear from the interview process that Mr. Durkin is the right candidate to be our next Principal and Chief Academic Officer," said Mr. Richard J. O'Hara, President and Interim Principal at John Carroll. "His love of students, passion for education, and pursuit of excellence in all his endeavors make me fully confident that he will provide strong academic leadership for John Carroll well into the future."

Mr. Durkin's goals for his first year:

- Meet with all teachers individually to find out what he can do to help each person professionally.
- Get to know as many students as possible by being visible whenever and wherever students are engaged in academics and extracurricular activities.
- Complete a comprehensive review of all the curriculum.
- Implement a policy that requires that all assessments be returned within 72 hours.
- Begin the development of John Carroll's Writing Program, which will standardize writing assignments across the curriculum.
- Develop a John Carroll Transitions Program for ninth graders that will help our new Patriots assimilate into a college preparatory environment, focusing on organizational skills, note-taking skills, and study skills.
- Review and examine the possibility of expanding the St. Joseph Program to help our unique learners.

Seeking a “Great Perhaps”

Morgan Jones '13 Explores Caves Across the Globe

Once Morgan Jones '13 has a goal set, nothing will stand in her way of achieving it. She has known that she wanted to be a geologist since the sixth grade. She worked five jobs as a student at John Carroll to help her parents pay for her education. When she graduated and attended Hofstra University, she cut her jobs down to three but added 21 credits every semester so she could graduate in three years, the most economical way for someone to finish school, since she was paying her own way.

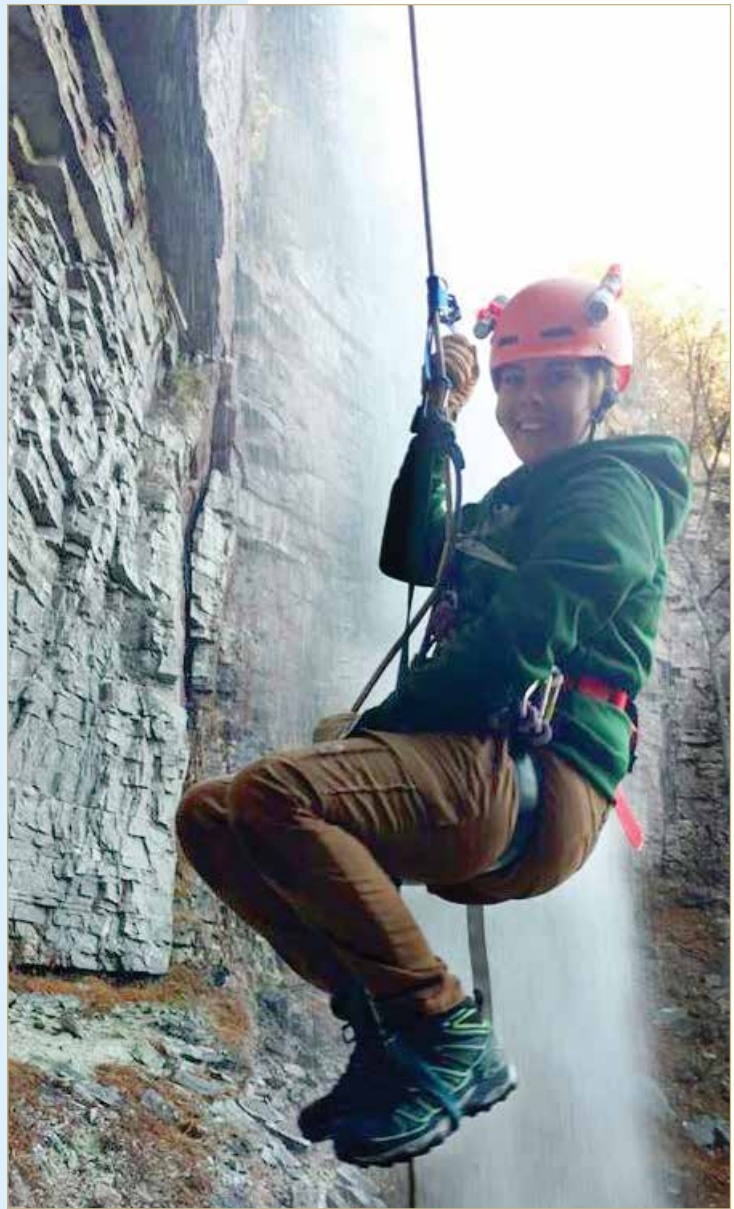
During her time at Hofstra, Morgan met a cave explorer named Chris Nikola, who took her to her first wild cave and would become her mentor. Nikola introduced Morgan to a new world of expeditions and researching animals that few have ever seen in person. “I never thought I'd be into caving or geoarchaeology, but now I'm going on expeditions to study blind cave fish in Mexico and blind salamanders in Slovenia,” Morgan remarked. In addition to Mexico and Slovenia, Morgan has also traveled to Romania, Hungary, Italy, Russia, the Galapagos Islands, the Amazon Rainforest, the Andes Mountains, other parts of Ecuador, Canada, Iceland, Australia and almost every state in the United States. Enjoying her expeditions and wanting to hone her technical skills, after she graduated from Hofstra with a Bachelor of Science degree in geology and four minors

in anthropology, sustainability, Russian and geography, she decided to take a semester off from school to travel more before starting graduate school.


Her trips have had their fair share of danger. Cave collapses, low amounts of oxygen, getting lost or left in complete darkness are all risks, but they don't phase Morgan. “Dangers are everywhere, but if you follow the rules, don't take shortcuts and don't try to act like Indiana Jones, you're very safe.” The reward for Morgan is well worth the risk. “A motto I adopted was, ‘I go to seek a great perhaps,’ by François Rabelais. After finishing their research early, a small team comprised of Morgan and four others noticed an opening near the entrance of the cave they were exploring. After setting up their ladder, the team descended into the void. They were in a maze cave, which meant the passages went up and down, taking many twists and turns. The team reached what they thought was the end of the cave, until they encountered a large vertical sloping flow stone wall. "It was extremely difficult to climb," Morgan said, "and the experienced cavers decided that would be it, we needed to turn around." Morgan was determined to capture a photo, so she tried to climb the wall. Her small feet were able to grip the flow stone. Getting higher, she could see bats and debris inside an opening above her. "The head of the party told me that I could keep going but only if I felt it safe enough, since I would be going alone, and wherever I went, I would have to come back by myself," she said. "If I got stuck or hurt, they weren't going to be able to get to me easily." Everyone else was too big to fit through the small holes. She persisted onward.

After dislodging a log, Morgan steadied her feet and lifted herself up into darkness. She had discovered a new chamber passage! "Bats were swooping overhead, tailless whip scorpions were crawling up the walls, and frogs and crickets were covering the floor amongst the leaves that fell through the opening," she recalled. "It was truly breathtaking!" She called back to her group describing what she saw, and the

head of the party told her she had entered a virgin cave. With this new discovery comes the right to name the passage, so Morgan declared it Cowan Passage in honor of her mother's side of the family and all of the support she received from them to follow her dreams.

Morgan is also grateful for the support she received from her teachers and peers at John Carroll, and for the financial aid she was awarded that made it possible for her to earn a John Carroll diploma. Morgan worked hard to take every opportunity John Carroll had to offer and make those who donated toward tuition assistance proud of their contribution. She participated in countless clubs and honor societies while maintaining a stellar GPA and working five jobs. "I never slept, I never had a day off, and I enjoyed every single minute of it," she said.

"It is the most remarkable thing to wake up living an adventure," remarked Morgan Jones, looking back at her experiences and ahead to her upcoming expedition to Greece. She will soon be heading there to complete her thesis for her master's in sustainability and volcanology through Hofstra University. She's also in the initiation process for the Explorer's Club, an exclusive science expedition club in New York City. After she finishes her master's, she will pursue a Ph.D. in geology or geoarchaeology and will move on to seeking that next "great perhaps."

Remembering Josh Hamer '19

After a fatal accident that took the life of sophomore Josh Hamer, the John Carroll community found many ways to remember Josh, support the Hamer family and help each other heal. Hundreds attended a candle-light prayer vigil and even more attended his wake and funeral. After dealing with the loss of Josh, two students felt the Holy Spirit stirring inside them and made the decision to be baptized in Christ. In a speech before the final school-wide Mass, Ashley Schwartz '18 dedicated her Baptism, which would happen during that Mass, to Josh and the Hamer family. "Although this death was one of most heartbreaking things to go through, it pushed me right towards God and towards faith," she said. Ashley also received her first Holy Communion at that Mass.

To assist the Hamer family, the John Carroll community raised over \$35,000 to pay for Josh's funeral and burial expenses, with anything above the cost going towards a scholarship in his name. Over \$10,000 of that amount was raised thanks to the Aberdeen IronBirds, who hosted a baseball game between Gilman and John Carroll at Leidos Field at Ripken Stadium. Donations were accepted at the gates, and the IronBirds donated the proceeds from their concession sales that night. To honor Josh, the IronBirds presented the Hamer family with a personalized IronBirds jersey. They will also hang Josh's jersey in the main concourse and wear a commemorative patch throughout the 2017 season. The John Carroll Parent Association also honored Josh by donating a flag pole and flags, which were installed at the John Carroll baseball field in Josh's memory.

We are all one family and one publication so we all work together to make sure things get posted,” she said. In addition to the Online Pacemaker Award, *The Patriot* also won a Silver Crown Award from the Columbia Scholastic Press Association for the third year in a row.
